Operational Priorities

UCAR is currently implementing its next-generation ERM program. The framework guiding this effort is intended to ensure that risks are appropriately

identified and managed. To do this, the ERM office is advancing the following operational priorities:

- Transform UCAR's method of identifying evaluating, and communicating risk to ensure that the right people are engaged at the right time.
- Redesign UCAR's incident response structure and processes to best meet organizational needs.
- Introduce ERM governance and management systems to promote an ongoing culture of risk awareness.
- Bolster risk awareness through an emphasis on risk training and communication.
